

**Dianne (Deanne) Judson** died suddenly at St. Michael's Hospital, Toronto on November 21, 2006. She died peacefully.

Deanne was born in Australia. She graduated from Meridan Ladies College and came to Canada as a young woman. She worked at TV Ontario (TVO) and then in the Canadian film business. Amongst her achievements she produced the first official Canadian/British co-production, Rag Time Summer, starring David Warner. She lived in Los Angeles for seven years, developing film projects, including Prom Night. Deanne went back to Australia and worked with artist Martin Sharpe, producing a feature documentary with Tiny Tim, which played at the Toronto International Film Festival.

Deanne returned to Toronto and worked with Richard Nielson and produced No Price Too High, The Battle of Vimy Ridge and Bonhoeffer. She also co-produced the feature film Waiting for Michelangelo.

Deanne loved animals; she was devoted to her dogs and cats. She had many foster children; she was a devoted Christian, deeply spiritual and a very fine and gifted painter.

Deanne lived for fifteen years with John Bradshaw. She is survived by her brothers Chris and Michael and her father Allan Judson, her many friends in Canada, Australia and around the world.

We will miss her.
